### **Our Project**

Our names are Athena and Ali and we are currently taking INT519 (Green Umbrella Learning Lab) with Mr. Kelly. The purpose of the class is to create and complete a sustainability-focused project on campus, and we are focused on the teaching of sustainability within the humanities in hopes of bringing more attention to environmentalism outside of the purely scientific perspective.

Our inspiration for the project came from Exeter's Climate Action Plan. We decided to narrow our focus on the humanities departments solely because the Science department has already integrated modules on sustainability/climate change into its Chemistry, Physics, and Biology sequences, thereby partially meeting this goal and impacting many students' educations.
